



This Week's Reflection...

One of my most favorite ministries is working with the RCIA. RCIA stands for Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is a program through which adults who desire to become Catholic learn about our faith and come into full communion with the Church.

I especially love the questions that are asked by the candidates in RCIA. A couple of weeks ago I was asked, "Since we did not participate in the sin of Adam and Eve why do we suffer the consequences of their actions?" That is a great question. We call the sin committed by Adam and Eve original sin. Original sin is unlike personal sin, original sin is not an evil thing <u>we have</u> done but an absence of God's grace in our souls. It may be more helpful to think of original sin not as a "stain" on our souls but as a missing piece of essential fabric or a "hole" in our souls. Baptism "removes" original sin, therefore, by filling our souls with the love and life of God, or grace. The reason this absence of grace is called original sin is because it is a consequence of the very first sin humans committed.

When our first parents, Adam and Eve, disobeyed God, they lost the gift of God's favor that protected them from death and suffering. After losing this grace, they could not pass it down to their descendants, who in turn could not pass it down to us. Adam and Eve's disobedience corrupted our human nature and made it possible for humans to suffer and die. Baptism cannot prevent our physical deaths because it does not change our physical nature. However, it does change our spiritual nature, so through baptism we are saved from spiritual death by being united to Jesus Christ.





WE WILL NOT HAVE HOLY HOUR OR CONFESSIONS **ON ASH WEDNESDAY.**

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive on Holy Thursday.

- Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.
- Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Due to the Pandemic, the Diocese of Atlanta will follow the instructions from the Vatican for the distribution of ashes:

The priest "cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes ashes to those who come to him or, *if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing* in their places. He then sprinkles the ashes on each person's head."

WE WILL NOT HAVE A LENTEN PENANCE SERVICE ADDED CONFESSION TIMES DURING LENT

March 15 & 16 from 6 - 7pm March 22 & 23 from 6 - 7pm March 17 & 24 - beginning at 6pm with 2 priests available

Saturdays, March 20 and 27 at 9am, 10am & 11am Saturday confessions will begin at each hour. The priest will hear confession until the line ends and return at the beginning of the next hour.

For your safety, confession takes place in a well ventilated room with ionic air purifiers. Masks, social distancing, and a protective screen are used.


