



#### **Weekly Reflection**

March 9th, 2025 Dignity for the Deceased

In the Catholic faith, the practices surrounding the treatment of the deceased are deeply rooted in respect for the human person and the belief in the resurrection of the body. The Church strongly discourages the scattering of ashes and emphasizes the importance of a Catholic funeral because these practices uphold the dignity of the deceased and express the hope of eternal life.

The Church teaches that the body, even after death, retains a sacred significance because it was the temple of the Holy Spirit during life. Cremated remains are to be treated with the same reverence as a body, which is why they must be placed in a sacred, final resting place, such as a cemetery or columbarium. Scattering ashes, dividing them among family members, or keeping them at home can diminish this sense of sacredness and fail to reflect the Christian hope in the resurrection. A proper burial ensures the remains are laid to rest in a holy and communal setting, where they await the resurrection of the dead.

Having a Catholic funeral is equally important because it allows the Church to intercede for the soul of the deceased through the celebration of the Eucharist, prayers, and blessings. The funeral Mass is a profound act of faith, where the community gathers to commend the soul of the departed to God's mercy and offer consolation to the grieving. It reinforces the belief that death is not an end but a transition to eternal life with God.

Additionally, a Catholic funeral provides a tangible expression of hope in Christ's promise of salvation. It offers the grieving an opportunity to reflect on the mysteries of life, death, and resurrection, drawing strength and peace from their faith.

By ensuring the proper care of remains and celebrating a Catholic funeral, the faithful affirm their belief in the sanctity of life, the resurrection, and God's infinite mercy, offering a witness to the world of the hope that comes from faith in Christ.




## Pilgrimage Sites for the Jubilee of Hope

#### Sacramental Preparation & Information

#### **INFANT BAPTISM**

Parents must be members of St. James for at least 3 months or have the pastor's permission, and must complete the Belonging online course through Ascension Press as preparation. Both parents and Godparents are required to take the on-line course. For any questions, please refer to our St. James the Apostle website at stjamesapostlecatholicchurch.com. Baptisms are normally celebrated on the first Saturday of the month at 10:30am.

#### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Children in the second grade, and active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years, are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special preparation sessions are held throughout the year before the reception of these sacraments. Contact the Faith Formation office 770-957-5441 ext. 108.

#### CONFIRMATION

Youth in the 10th grade or older, and active in the teen program of the parish for at least two consecutive years, will be eligible to register for Confirmation. Contact the Youth Ministry office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110 for more information. For Adult Confirmation preparation, contact Deacon Charles Iner at ciner@stjamesapostle.com or 770-957-5441 ext. 201. Couples considering marriage must contact the parish office at least six months before the projected date and must attend a pre-marriage program.
