

Sacramental Preparation & Information Infant Baptism

Parents must be members of St. James for at least 3 months or have the pastor's permission and must complete the Belonging online course through Ascension Press as preparation. Both parents and Godparents are required to take the online course. For any questions, please refer to our St. James the Apostle website at stjamesapostlecatholicchurch.com. Baptisms are normally celebrated on the first and second Saturday of the month at 10:30am.

First Holy Communion

Children in the second grade and active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special preparation sessions are held throughout the year before the reception of these sacraments. Contact the Faith Formation office 770-957-5441 ext.108.

Confirmation

Youth in the 10th grade or older and active in the teen program of the parish for at least two consecutive years will be eligible to register for Confirmation. Contact the Youth Ministry office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110 for more information.

Adult Confirmation/OCIA

Marriage

Couples considering marriage must contact the parish office at least six months before the projected date and must attend a pre-marriage program.

Anointing of the Sick

Contact the Parish Office to make arrangements. If this is an emergency situation after hours, please call the Parish Office and press "1" for a sacramental emergency.

Holy Communion for the Sick

If you or a loved one is in the hospital or in an assisted living situation, either temporarily or long term, please call the Parish Office Monday-Thursday to arrange a visit. This must be arranged prior to any weekend Mass.



Weekly Reflection

The Need for Prayer in Our Catholic Life

Prayer is essential to the Catholic faith, serving as a direct communication with God. It is through prayer that we express love, seek guidance, and invite God to work in our lives. Just as our bodies need nourishment, our souls require prayer to thrive. Without prayer, our relationship with God weakens.

At its heart, prayer strengthens our relationship with God. Just as spending time with family and friends deepens bonds, prayer opens our hearts to God's love, allowing us to share our joys and struggles. Jesus Himself frequently withdrew to pray, demonstrating the importance of prayer, even for God incarnate.

Prayer also helps us navigate life's uncertainties. In difficult times, prayer reassures us of God's control, as Philippians 4:6 reminds us: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Prayer also provides strength to resist temptation and sin, inviting God's grace to help us stay faithful.

Growing in holiness is a lifelong journey, and prayer is key to this transformation. By regularly praying, we open our hearts to God's grace, aligning our lives with His will. St. Teresa of Avila called prayer "nothing else than being on terms of friendship with God," highlighting its role in spiritual growth.

Finally, prayer unites us with the broader Church. Whether at Mass, in family, or in parish groups, communal prayer connects us with Catholics worldwide, strengthening the Body of Christ. A strong prayer life deepens our relationship with God, offers strength in challenges, helps us grow in holiness, and connects us with the Church.

Let us embrace prayer as a daily habit, allowing God's grace to guide and transform us.


