Sacramental Preparation & Information Infant Baptism

Parents must be members of St. James for at least 3 months or have the pastor's permission and must complete the Belonging online course through Ascension Press as preparation. Both parents and Godparents are required to take the online course. For any questions, please refer to our St. James the Apostle website at stjamesapostlecatholicchurch.com. Baptisms are normally celebrated on the first and second Saturday of the month at 10:30am.

First Holy Communion

Children in the second grade and active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special preparation sessions are held throughout the year before the reception of these sacraments. Contact the Faith Formation office 770-957-5441 ext.108.

Confirmation

Youth in the 10th grade or older and active in the teen program of the parish for at least two consecutive years will be eligible to register for Confirmation. Contact the Youth Ministry office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110 for more information.

Marriage

Couples considering marriage must contact the parish office at least six months before the projected date and must attend a pre-marriage program.

Each month, the St. Vincent de Paul Conference at St. James hosts support days where our dedicated counselors

meet with neighbors from Henry County. We offer not only financial assistance, but also a listening ear and spiritual support, helping to ease heavy burdens and, whenever possible, prevent homelessness.

We are the only SVDP Conference serving Henry County, and the need is growing. Since 2020, the county's population has increased by 21%, now exceeding 266,000. At the same time, housing and utility costs have risen to historic highs. We are seeing the most expensive rents our neighbors have ever faced.

Because our resources are limited, we are forced to limit the number of people we can serve. **Just last week, we saw nearly 50 individuals and families seeking help.** Thanks to your generosity, we were able to assist most of them, and we are deeply grateful. Every gift matters. Every dollar makes a difference. Your donations may well have kept someone from losing their home.

St. James the Apostle

St. James the Greater - July 25th

Saint James the Apostle is also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater, to distinguish him from the other James in Jesus' group of twelve. Most of what we know about Saint lames is recorded in the New Testament. He and his brother John were collected by Jesus along the Sea of Galilee. Matthew 4:18-22 tells the story of Jesus calling first Simon Peter and his brother Andrew and then the sons of Zebedee. In Mark 3:17, the brothers receive a nickname from Jesus, who calls them "sons of thunder" because of their many extreme reactions, like that in Luke 9:54 when they offer to call down fire on a Samaritan village.

Saint James was part of Jesus' intimate circle, a witness to the Transfiguration, the resurrection of Jarius' daughter, and the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. In A.D. 44 Herod Agrippa had "James, the brother of John, killed by the sword." (Acts 12:2) He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is written of in the New Testament.

According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, Spain where his relics were rediscovered in 9th century. This tradition has sometimes been attributed to a passage in the Song of Roland which tells of St. James appearing to Charlemagne in a dream, prophesying that Charlemagne would conquer the Moors in Spain. This was followed by a vision of stars which if followed would lead to the saint's lost tomb. In the Middle Ages Compostela was a hugely popular pilgrimage site. The saint's relics continue to rest in the cathedral there and one can still undertake the pilgrimage.

Today, we remember St. James not only as one of Jesus' closest followers and the first apostle to give his life for the Gospel, but also as the patron of our parish.

In honor of his feast day, let us give thanks for his example and seek his intercession for our parish family. May we, like St. James, walk closely with the Lord and grow in courage and love.


