Sacramental Preparation & Information

Infant Baptism

Parents must be registered parishioners of St. James for at least three months (or have the pastor's permission) and complete the *Belonging* online course from Ascension Press. Godparents are also required to complete the course. Visit stjamesapostlecatholicchurch.com for details. Baptisms are typically celebrated the first and second Saturdays of each month at 10:30 a.m.

First Holy Communion

Children in second grade who have been active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special sessions are held throughout the year in preparation for these sacraments. For more information, contact the Faith Formation Office at 770-957-5441 ext. 108.

Confirmation

Youth in 10th grade or older who have been active in the parish teen program for at least two consecutive years are eligible to register for Confirmation. For more information, contact the Youth Ministry Office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110.

Adult Confirmation/OCIA

For Adult Confirmation and Sacraments of Initiation, contact Deacon Charles Iner at ciner@stjamesapostle.com or 770-957-5441 ext. 201.

Marriage

Couples considering marriage must contact the Parish Office at least six months before their desired wedding date and participate in a pre-marriage preparation program.

Anointing of the Sick

Contact the Parish Office to make arrangements. If this is an emergency situation after hours, please call the Parish Office and press "1" for a sacramental emergency.

Holy Communion for the Sick

If you or a loved one is in the hospital or an assisted living facility—whether temporarily or long-term—please call the Parish Office Monday through Thursday to arrange a visit. Visits must be scheduled prior to any weekend Mass.




Make a New Year's Resolution to get more involved at St. James!

Weekly Meditation

The Feast of the Epiphany

St. Matthew tells us something easy to overlook but deeply important: after encountering the Christ Child, the Magi "went home by another way." It's a simple line, but it reveals the heart of the Epiphany.

The Magi came as seekers. They followed a star, trusting that God was drawing them somewhere beyond their own understanding. Their journey was marked by effort, risk, and persistence. When they finally arrived, they did not find a king in a palace, but a child in humility. And yet, they recognized Him. They knelt. They worshiped. They offered their gifts.

That encounter changed everything.

They could not return the same way they came—not just because of Herod's threat, but because they themselves were no longer the same. Once you encounter Christ, the old routes no longer make sense. The old priorities lose their hold. The familiar paths no longer satisfy.

The Epiphany is not just about Christ being revealed to the nations; it is about what happens after that revelation. An authentic encounter with Jesus always calls for conversion. It demands movement. It invites change.

We often want an encounter with God that leaves our lives untouched. We want comfort without challenge, grace without transformation. But the Magi remind us that meeting Christ means going home differently—thinking differently, loving differently, choosing differently.

We may still return to the same jobs, families, and routines. But if we have truly encountered the Lord—especially in the Eucharist—we should not return unchanged. Our hearts should be softer. Our faith more intentional. Our courage stronger. Our generosity deeper.

The question the Epiphany places before us is simple but demanding:

Have we truly encountered Christ—and if so, are we willing to go home by another way?
