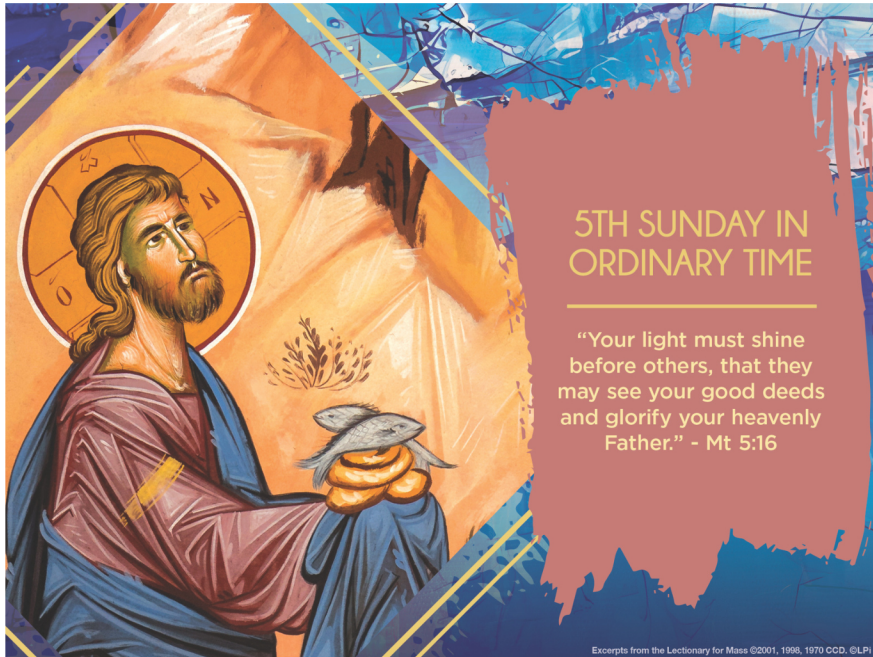

Sacramental Preparation & Information

Infant Baptism

Parents must be registered parishioners of St. James for at least three months (or have the pastor's permission) and complete the *Belonging* online course from Ascension Press. Godparents are also required to complete the course. Visit stjamesapostleatholicchurch.com for details. Baptisms are typically celebrated the first and second Saturdays of each month at 10:30 a.m.

First Holy Communion

Children in second grade who have been active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special sessions are held throughout the year in preparation for these sacraments. For more information, contact the Faith Formation Office at 770-957-5441 ext. 108.

Confirmation

Youth in 10th grade or older who have been active in the parish teen program for at least two consecutive years are eligible to register for Confirmation. For more information, contact the Youth Ministry Office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110.

Adult Confirmation/OCIA

For Adult Confirmation and Sacraments of Initiation, contact Deacon Charles Iner at ciner@stjamesapostle.com or 770-957-5441 ext. 201.

Marriage

Couples considering marriage must contact the Parish Office at least six months before their desired wedding date and participate in a pre-marriage preparation program.

Anointing of the Sick

Contact the Parish Office to make arrangements. If this is an emergency situation after hours, please call the Parish Office and press "1" for a sacramental emergency.

Holy Communion for the Sick

If you or a loved one is in the hospital or an assisted living facility—whether temporarily or long-term—please call the Parish Office Monday through Thursday to arrange a visit. Visits must be scheduled prior to any weekend Mass.

New Beginnings February Calendar

January has been a busy month for our emergency hotel program. We helped a couple who were homeless and living in a tent, a single mother with four children, a single mother taking care of her aging father and a sister with cancer along with her three children, and a 69-year-old woman taking care of her ailing son. Please keep them in your prayers.

- Tomorrow morning, **Monday, Feb. 9 at 10:00am**, we will be gathering in the **parish hall** to pack and deliver food for 45 food insecure families. These are families of students at three Title I schools in Henry County who would otherwise have little to eat over winter break. Some are fortunate to live in a rental property. Others live in hotels and even in their parent's car.

- On **Saturday, Feb. 28th**, we will gather to pack **Grace Bags at 10:15am** after the Millions of Monicas prayer group.

SVdP: A Year in Review

From October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul assisted neighbors throughout Henry County with \$78,357.20 in aid.

Weekly Meditation

The Obligation of Attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days

Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days because it is a core expression of our faith and a direct command from God and the Church. This obligation is not just a rule—it is a privilege and a spiritual necessity. At Mass, we worship God, receive the Eucharist, and strengthen our relationship with Him and the Church.

The foundation of this duty is the Third Commandment: “Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day” (Exodus 20:8). From the beginning, God set aside one day each week for rest and worship. For Christians, Sunday—the day of Christ’s Resurrection—became the Lord’s Day. By attending Mass, we honor this command and celebrate Jesus’ victory over sin and death.

The Church emphasizes this obligation to protect the spiritual well-being of the faithful. The Catechism teaches that “the Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice” (CCC 2181). At Mass, we receive Jesus Himself—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. To deliberately miss Mass without a serious reason is a grave sin because it neglects the grace and nourishment our souls need.

Mass is also a communal celebration. We gather not just as individuals but as the Body of Christ. Worshiping together strengthens our unity and encourages us to live our faith more fully in the world.

More than a duty, Mass is a gift. In the prayers, readings, homily, and Eucharist, we encounter Christ and are renewed in faith. Regular participation draws us closer to God, deepens our love for Him, and helps us face life’s challenges with hope and strength.

Attending Mass faithfully is how we honor God, grow in holiness, and live the fullness of our Catholic faith.
